Extra notes

A pretty 1910/20s country chair with a pleasing colour. Not of any great commercial value I am afraid, but it would be worth gluing up the joints and giving it a wax. The Edwardian period is the period covering the reign of King Edward VII, 1901 to 1910. The death of Queen Victoria in January 1901 and the succession of her son Edward marked the end of the Victorian era. The Edwardian period corresponds to the French Belle Époque period. Artists were overall influenced by the development of the automobile and electricity, and a greater awareness of human rights. The change or reversal in taste from the Victorian eclectic styles corresponded with the historical revivals of the period, most prominently earlier Georgian and Neoclassical styles of the late 18th and early 19th centuries.
